Student Development

The Student Development Office offers educational and social experiences that enhance the quality of student life and learning. Sponsored trips and activities introduce students to the world of art, culture, and performance by providing opportunities to experience visual art, music, theater, and dance, both locally and in larger metropolitan areas such as New York City and Philadelphia. Additionally, the office supports trips and activities that align with students' interests in sports and general entertainment, ensuring a diverse range of options each semester. In collaboration with student organizations, the Student Development Office also offers students a variety of local entertainment choices, including discounted bowling and movie passes, and yoga classes at a local studio.

The office also houses the Wilkes Adventure Education program, which provides experiential learning opportunities that challenge students to engage in physically demanding activities that emphasize wellness while providing practical leadership tools and lessons on teamwork. Students can sign up for adventures like hiking, rock climbing, mountain biking, and cross-country trips to iconic locations such as the Grand Canyon National Park.

Introduced by the Bonner Foundation in 1990 with the motto “Access to Education, Opportunity to Serve,” Bonner has grown into a nationally acclaimed, four-year, service-based program with a network of more than 70 colleges and universities.

Bonner leaders follow a four-year student development model that blends direct service in the Wilkes-Barre community along with enrichment and training activities designed to promote students’ leadership, self-awareness, and professional skill set.

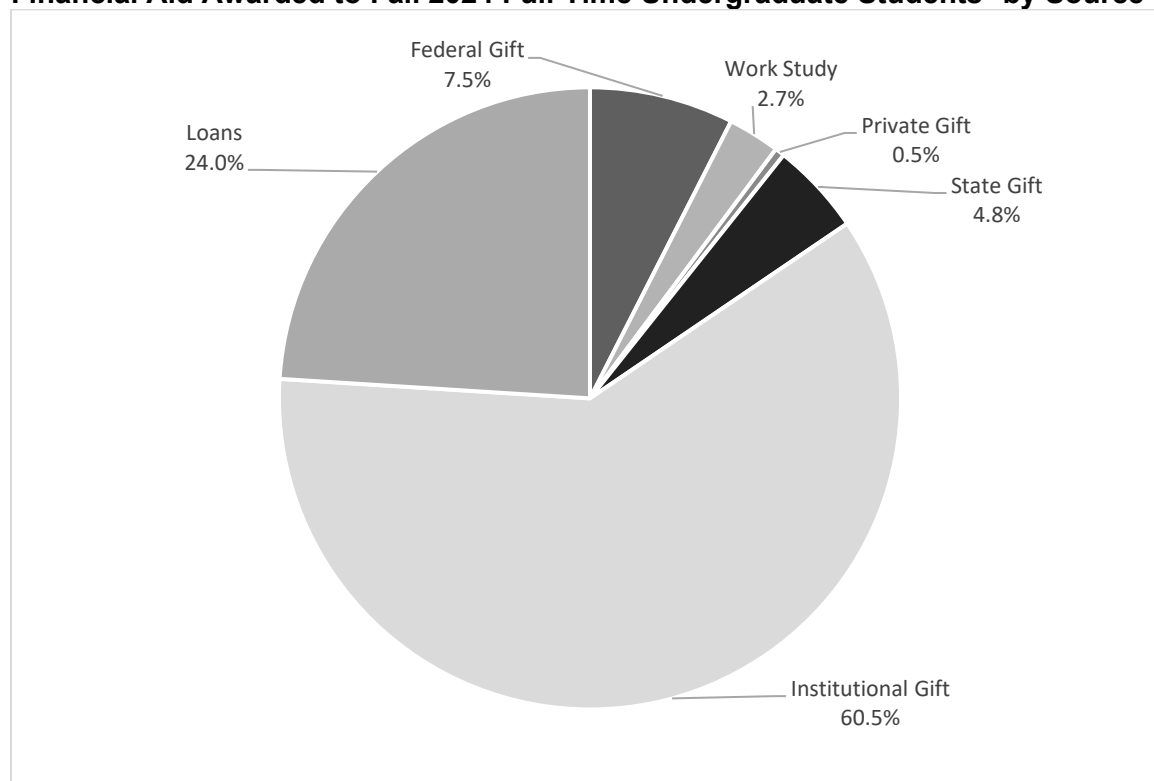

GLOSSARY

Census Date

The completion of six weeks of classes

First-Generation Student

A student for whom neither parent graduated from a 4-year institution

First-Professional Program

The First-Professional Program requires the completion of the academic requirements to begin practice in the profession; at least two years of college work prior to entering the program; and a total of at least six academic years of college work to complete the degree program, including prior required college work plus the length of the professional program itself.

First-Professional Student

A student enrolled in the Pharmacy Program

First-Time Freshman

An entering freshman who has never attended any college. Includes students enrolled in the fall term who attended for the first time in the prior summer term. Includes students who entered with advanced standing (college credits earned before graduation from high school).

FTE (Full-Time Equivalent)

A full-time Undergraduate, Graduate, or First-Professional Student is equivalent to one FTE
Part-time Undergraduate FTE is calculated by multiplying Part-time Undergraduate Enrollment by .392857. Part-time Graduate and First-Professional FTE is calculated by multiplying part-time enrollment by .382059. (IPEDS definition used for fall enrollment reporting)

Full-time Student

Undergraduate and First-Professional - A student enrolled for twelve or more semester credits each term
Graduate - A student enrolled for nine or more semester credits

Graduate Student

A student who holds a bachelor's or first-professional degree, or equivalent, and is taking courses at the post-baccalaureate level

Nonresident

A person who is not a citizen or national of the United States and who is in this country on a visa or temporary basis and does not have the right to remain indefinitely

Part-time Student

Undergraduate and First-Professional - A student enrolled for less than twelve credits
Graduate - A student enrolled for less than nine credits

Tenure

Status of a personnel position, or a person occupying a position or occupation, with respect to permanence of the position

Tenure Track

Status of personnel positions that lead to consideration for tenure

Undergraduate Student

A student enrolled in a four-year bachelor's degree program
