#### STORY OF THE BALLET

#### ACT I, SCENE I

The curtain rises on a street in a little German town of the 19th century. Guests are hurrying to the home of Dr. Stahlbaum, the mayor, for a Christmas party. Klara and Fritz, the mayor's children, are excitedly waiting for the party to begin. Among the guests is the eccentric Uncle Drosselmeier. He gives the children toys, and provides a marionette theater for their entertainment. With his apparently magical powers, he animates life-size dolls, i.e., a Pierrot clown, etc. Klara's special present from her uncle is a very unusual nutcracker. As Fritz attempts to steal it, the nutcracker is damaged. Much to Klara's relief, Uncle Drosselmeier is able to mend the broken toy. The party ends with the traditional grandfather dance. The guests depart, Klara and Fritz are put to bed, and quiet settles over the house.

#### Scene 2

Too excited to sleep, Klara creeps back into the parlor to see if her beloved nutcracker is safe. Cradling the doll, she falls asleep under the Christmas tree and has a fantastic dream in which giant mice threaten her. Suddenly, the Christmas tree begins to grow, the nutcracker toy becomes the life-sized Enchanted Nutcracker, and the other enchanted toys begin to move. In the battle between the soldiers and the mice, the Mouse King almost overpowers the soldiers and threatens the brave Enchanted Nutcracker. To save the Nutcracker, Klara throws her shoe at the Mouse King to weaken his power. After the defeat of the mice, the Enchanted Nutcracker turns into a handsome prince who takes Klara on a fabulous journey.

#### Scene 3

Continuing their journey, the Enchanted Nutcracker and Klara enter the Snow Forest, where they encounter an elegant Snow Queen and her court of swirling Snowflakes.

#### Act II

Continuing their journey, Klara and the Nutcracker Prince arrive at a majestic castle in the Land of Sweets. They are greeted by a band of winsome angels and the Sugar Plum Fairy who, in turn, introduces them to visitors from Spain, Arabia, Russia, China, and Germany. After telling these new friends of their adventures, and especially about the furious battle with the giant mice, Klara and her companion are entertained by a series of ethnic dances. The festivities continue with the beautiful Waltz of the Flowers with the Dew Drop Fairy. As morning approaches, everyone joins in a final dance. Bidding wistful farewell to her new friends in the enchanted land, Klara is returned home, perhaps wondering if her adventure really happened or was merely part of a fabulous dream.

#### Dr. TJ Firneno

TJ Firneno is a native of White Haven, Pennsylvania. He began dancing with Ballet Northeast/The Degnan Ballet Center in 1999 and continues to guest artist with the Degnan Ballet Center at the Wilkes Conservatory. Over the past 20+ years, Dr. Firneno has been seen in many supporting roles in Ballet Northeast repertoire including Hillarion in Giselle (2011), the Jester in Cinderella (2003 & 2008), Beethoven's Seventh (2007 & 2010), Von Rothbart in Swan Lake (2009), and Drosselmeier in The Nutcracker (2010-present). He has performed lead roles including the title character in The Nutcracker (2005 & 2006), Concerto Brilliante (2006), and, most notably, in Joplin (2007 & 2009). Some of

his choreographic works have been seen on the BNE stage including original pieces and adaptations.

Dr. Firneno received his PhD in Quantitative Biology from The University of Texas at Arlington in 2021 and is currently a National Science Foundation Postdoctoral Research Fellow in the Larson Lab at the University of Denver. Dr. Firneno has also continued to pursue his passion in the performing arts frequently acting, directing, designing, and producing for many community and university theaters in Pittsburgh, PA and Dallas/Fort Worth, TX. Though he currently resides in Denver, CO, he splits his time between there and Harrisburg, PA with his husband, Jake, and their three cats.
