Description:

The mission of the Wilkes University First Year Student e-Mentoring Program is to ease the transition of new students to college and provide a supportive environment for academic success and personal growth. The program helps each new student connect with peers, upperclassmen, and the institution as a whole.

A First Year Student e-Mentor is a full-time undergraduate student who leads a group of approximately 12-25 new students throughout the first semester of their career at Wilkes University, beginning at summer Orientation and concluding at the end of the 2022 fall semester.

Objectives:

- To acquaint new students with all aspects of Wilkes University;
- To provide a resourceful environment for academic enrichment and personal growth;
- To support interactions and connections with peers, staff and faculty;
- To promote participation in meaningful campus activities.

Qualifications:

In order to apply for a FYS e-Mentor position, you must:

- Hold full-time undergraduate status;
- Have a 2.5 cumulative grade point average or higher (as of December 31, 2021);
- Possess NO active academic or disciplinary sanctions;
- Be available for all mandatory mentor events (outlined in the Important Dates section).

Expectations:

- Attend all meetings and events for FYS e-Mentors;
- Complete all mentoring programming components;
- Establish a climate of trust, support, and encouragement;
- Set positive examples for others in personal, academic, and social behavior;
- Be knowledgeable about campus services for appropriate referral;
- Lead and facilitate group discussion and activity;
- Attend and encourage attendance at various University sponsored events;
- Adhere to all guidelines set forth in the FYS e-Mentor contract and manual.

First-Year Student Summer Orientation - 2022:

The Office of Student Affairs will be hosting FYS Summer Orientation on July 7, 8, 11, 12, and 13, 2022. This year, Orientation will be offered as a one-day, in person, on-campus session. Students will be able to choose from 5 days to attend 1 session. Guidelines will be provided on what days will be offered for specific majors. For example, students who have chosen Biology as a major should choose from July 7th and 8th or students who have chosen Psychology as a major should choose from July 12th and 13th. (*PLEASE NOTE: these are just examples. the specific dates for majors have not been decided yet.*) e-Mentors will be asked to align with major specific days and must be available for a minimum of 2 days of Orientation. More information will be provided within the month of March.

Leadership 298: Mentoring Practicum, Fall 2022:

- 3 credits (1 hour lecture, 2 hours FYF mentoring); credits approved for Leadership Minor
- Meeting time will be determined after enrollment
- <u>Instructors:</u> Dr. Anthony Kapolka, Director, FYF Program and Melissa Howells, Director, Student Development.

Course Objectives:

- review the philosophy, goals and ethics of the first-year foundation course and mentoring approaches within this framework
- help student understand mentoring as partnership providing informational and social support
- clarify the elements of peer leadership as they relate to the FYF 101 mentor position
- take a strengths-based approach to prepare student to become the best mentor possible

Skills:

- Participating in this course will help you improve skills such as:
 - o applying and modeling approaches to problem-solving
 - o facilitating and assessing student-student partnerships/collaboration
 - o debriefing and reflection techniques to enhance the impacts of mentoring
 - o becoming effective at bystander intervention and cultural fluency
 - o creating short, informal, engaging videos

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
